
Remembering 2016—Looking Ahead To 2017

CedarWood International is dedicated to serving the community and building stronger families. We do this by providing food, clothing, and household items which assist families in financial need. We also build stronger families through relational influence—loving people in their current situation and throughout their growth process. As a division of The World For Jesus Ministries, we believe in ministering to the spirit as well as the body. The power of God’s love transforms individual lives and entire families.

2016 was an amazing year of growth and maturity for CedarWood. We did grow numerically, although not at the same pace as previous years. However, we did significantly expand our community impact and “footprint.” We formed key business relationships with new suppliers and partnered with several new community organizations. We share the perishable food left after our Pantry days with 7-10 other organizations on a regular basis. These organizations share that bounty with people we could not reach on our own. As we look back, we attribute that solely to God’s amazing grace and providence. During our Pantry days last year, we not only increased the volume of food clients take home, but we also saw significant improvements in the quality and variety of the food we distribute! We have been blessed to be able to provide our customers with the best nutrition on a regular basis.

This past year, some of the most memorable times for our customers have been at our special events. At this year’s “Back to School Bash”, every child who registered was provided with a backpack full of school supplies corresponding to their grade level. They also received coupons for free haircuts donated by local stylists, allowing them to look and feel their best as they returned to their studies. Other milestones of 2016 include: our first clothing drive fundraiser, a local Boy Scout troop food drive for CedarWood, partnering with others to provide holiday meals with all the trimmings for both Thanksgiving and Christmas, and also families who came to the Pantry before Christmas received brand-new toys for their children. We wish all of you could have seen the hope, joy, and grateful tears resulting from each of these events—all made possible by generous donors and volunteers.

CedarWood’s desire in 2017 is to continue growing as an organization—both in scope and depth. We need more volunteers as we experience increasing levels of resources which need to be processed and in our weekly customer volume. This year we will focus on recruiting and training a team of volunteers with specific responsibilities, freeing the staff to pursue our next-level goals.
